Recently Arrived Children and Youth

Communities across New York State are experiencing an influx of recently arrived and asylum-seeking students and families in advance of the 2023-24 school year. The Board of Regents and the State Education Department are committed to supporting Local Educational Agencies (LEAs) in the delivery of high-quality educational services to all students, including recently arrived children and youth. This memorandum provides important information for LEAs regarding the English Language Learner (ELL) Identification and Placement Regulations Part 154-2.3(a) and available resources to support students and families.
