The New York State Migrant Education Progratify (MEP), under Title I, Part Cof the Every Student Succeeds A (ESSA) of 2015, provide supplementary educational programs and supportive services to help migratory children overcome educational disruption, cultural and language barriers, social isolation, healthated problems, and othernique factors that inhibit the ability of such children and youth to succeed in school, and to pertine to make a successful transition to postsecondary education and/or employment.

The New York State Education Department (NYSED or "the Departmemet')quired to submit migrant subgroupdata to the U.SDepartment of Education (EDM) igrant-eligible students must be identified and coded correctly in SIRS ensure that this data submissions accurate and in compliance with federal laws, regulations of policies

To ensure that migrant children and youth have been accurately identified and served during the 2023-2024 school year, NYSED is requiring each school district to verify students coded as migrant-eligible in its student data management system against a list of students that have been issued official Certificates of Eligibility (COE) for migrant education program eligibility and participation. The goals this requestare to:

- (1) updatemigrant designations for students who are inaccurately codered,
- (2) submitaccurate migrant studendata for inclusion the Student Information Repository System (SIRS).

Migrant-eligible students must accurately identified and coded when reporting such data to SIR\$as per requirements under ESSA § 1304(b)(3).
